Principals in each Regional Academy continues to work with the Music Hubs where appropriates for individual pupils. We maintain links with the Devon and Torbay Music Hub and are setting up a Musician in Residence Project in Summer/Autumn 24 for Spring 2025 in one of our Devon Academies. This will focus on drumming and supporting secondary pupils manage and express emotions through the physical and sound outcomes of drumming.
